Since 2000, the city has been transformed through the construction of skyscrapers, shopping malls and multiplexes.

The BRTS and the Sabarmati River Front development project are also under progress. Kankaria Lake, Siddi Saiyad's Jali, Jama Masjid, Roza of Sarkhej are the historical monuments/places situated in the city. Gandhi Ashram, Abhay Ghat (Samadhi of Late. Prime Minister Shri Moraraji Desai), Science City, Vaishnovdevi Temple, ISCON Temple are also famous for the tourists attraction. Lothal, Step-Well of Adalaj & Akshardham Temple are also very famous tourist places nearby.

We look forward to welcoming you to Ahmedabad at the world famous river sabaramati and it's scenic beauty known as river front at the Hote Hyaat Regency Usmanpura, Ahmedabad on March 30-31st, 2024.
